




Use of Masks/Face Coverings

The IDPH recommends that everyone wear a mask or cloth face coverings in the community setting.

Type of Mask	Setting	Protective Factors
N95 Respirator	Healthcare	Filters out 95% of airborne particles
Surgical/Procedural Masks	Healthcare	Filters out large particles in the air, protects others in case the wearer has the virus
Cloth Mask/Face Covering	Non - Healthcare	Protects others in case the wearer has the virus

How to Safely Wear a Mask

- 1 Clean your hands before putting the mask on
- 2 Place the mask over the mouth and nose
- 3 Secure straps tightly
- Do not touch the front of the mask
- 5 Remove the mask by the straps
- 6 Clean your hands after taking the mask off
- 7 Store the mask in a clean place between uses







Cloth Face Coverings

- Cloth face coverings should:
 - o fit snugly
 - be secured with ties or ear loops
 - include multiple layers of fabric
 - allow for breathing without restriction
 - be able to be laundered and machine dried without damage or change to shape
- Wash the cloth face covering regularly
 - Hot wash, hot dry cycle






Use of Gloves

- Unlike face masks, gloves are not recommended for use by the general public
- Gloves should be used while cleaning and disinfecting surfaces or while handling potentially contaminated materials
- Glove use is not a substitute for performing hand hygiene
- Changes gloves if they become ripped or torn and remove carefully to prevent contamination

Hand Hygiene

- Both soap and water and alcohol based hand sanitizer are effective against SARS-CoV-2
- Clean your hands often, including
 - When you arrive at work and before you leave for the day
 - o Before eating
 - o After using the restroom
 - Before/after putting on/removing mask or gloves

CLEANING AND DISINFECTION



Cleaning and Disinfection

Hard, non-porous surfaces

- Identify high touch surfaces and disinfect them regularly
- Select a disinfectant that is EPA-approved to kill SARS-CoV-2
- Allow the surface to remain wet for the contact time specified on the label

Soft, porous surfaces

- Limit use of soft, porous objects that are difficult to clean
- Remove visible contamination first with appropriate cleaners
- · Select a disinfectant that is EPA-approved to kill SARS-CoV-2

Electronics


- Follow manufacturer's guidance for cleaning and disinfecting
- Consider using wipeable covers on electronics (tablets, keyboards)
- 70% alcohol can be used if manufacturer's guidelines do not recommend a specific product
