In-House Scanning Assess needs Create budget Buy equipment Test-run to set baseline standards and timeline

Assessing Needs

- How many items/pages will be scanned?
 - An exact count of pages, paper size, binding
- Who will be doing the work?
 - Staff or volunteers
 - When estimating staff/volunteer time account for holidays, vacation and sick time.
- Who is your audience?
 - Consider how and where your users will access the pages.

Budgeting

- Where will money come from to support project?
 - Is the money sustainable or grant generated?
 - Are there additional donors/funds/grants for future work?
- Over budget by 10%
 - If grant funded, you never want to give money back!
- Don't just buy online. Contact companies for best deals.

Assessing Needs: Equipment & Software

- What equipment/software do you have? What will you need?
 - Pick scanner large enough to handle your largest item.

 - OCR software (e.g. Adobe Acrobat Pro or ABBYY FineReader)
 - Scanning software (e.g. Vuescan or Readiris Pro)
- Preservation storage (e.g. physical storage files/external drives)

Assessing Needs: Maintenance and IT

- Who will be maintaining equipment and training users?
 - Do you have an IT department that can support the equipment?
 - Will the added work be covered under current contract?
- Consider up-front and long-term cost factors:
 - Equipment costs
 - Digitization costs (staff and equipment)
 - Set-up fees
 - Image maintenance and hosting costs (annual increases)

Copyright Oversimplified



- Copyright guidelines state publications published before 1923 are public domain
- Publications between 1923-1977 MAY be in public domain if items were not registered nor statement of copyright given
- Publications since 1978 are protected for 95 years from date of publication

- Interview a minimum of three vendors.
- Ask the vendor for references and examples.



- Look for additional collections (not mentioned) that are available online.
- Ask vendor to provide a free sample using your newspapers.

Internet Archive www.archive.org

- Scans materials as JPG2000 then converts to PDF to run optical character recognition software to create searchable text.
- Uses MARC records or Dublin Core for metadata can connect to library's catalog with Z39.50 but requires .cvs file
- Fees: \$3.00 set-up per ID (issue) then .30 per page for loose pages (11x15) \$2.40 per page for those larger than 11x15. Fees: \$3.00 set-up per ID (issue) then .12 per page for microfilm
 - Prices includes hosting the material on their website






Advantage Preservation Company

- Digitizes files at 300 dpi (B&W) PDFs for \$95.00 per microfilm reel
- Hosts scanned materials and creates a searchable website \$500.00
 - There is no way to search pages while browsing by issue
- Provides an external drive containing scanned images \$200.00
 - Files saved to drive are not in numerical/chronological order

Veridian

- Uses third-party (local) vendors for digitization
 - Scans items as TIFF images converts to PDFs
 - Cleans up images to remove de-skewing and cropping
 Create article segmentation
- - Perpetual licensing of software personal hosting \$10,000
 - Software and Veridian hosting of your digital materials:
 - 1 time set-up fee \$4,800
 - Annual hosting \$400 per month





- Will scan images and send you a sample for free.
- Scans at 300 or 400 DPI grayscale as TIFF or High Res JPG and converts to PDF to run optical character recognition software to create searchable text. Extra fees to create article segmentation.
- Cost for digitization of microfilm reels as low as .03 cents per image capture (page). Cost for hardcopy digitization starts at .50 cents per image.
- **Does not host digital images
