What is Friendship Club?



Serving Grades 3-8

Friendship Club is a program series where trained peers create a warm, welcoming and kind environment for children who find it difficult to make friends on their own.

Friendship Club is most beneficial for those children who are seeking social opportunities in a safe environment. Friendship Club can greatly benefit children who just need more practice and successes. We have welcomed a broad range of kids who want to make friends, from shy to non-verbal.

Ambassadors are in grades 4-12. They have attended a training session led by staff from the Northern Suburban Special Education District. Many have prior experience with special needs children, either from buddy programs at school or due to experience with relatives or friends.

A different activity is planned for each gathering and friends are paired with Ambassadors. Sometimes there are more Ambassadors than participants, in which case kids work together in small groups. When possible, we try to keep some consistency with pairings that were successful at past events.

Friendship Club welcomes children of all abilities. Parents complete an online form which requests information about accommodations, preferences, and hobbies/interests. The form also asks if a child requires a one-on-one aid in the classroom. If the answer to this question is "yes," parents are requested to wait for final confirmation that we have sufficient assistance to welcome their child. On a couple of occasions, parents have remained in the room.

In 2015 we hope to offer six Friendship Club events plus one Ambassador Training class which will be held on January 17, 2015.
