Topic #1: ¡Wepa! libros

Presenter: Allie Kreuz, Client Success Manager, iWepa libros!

About ¡Wepa!

- Headquarters in Elgin, IL; has a customer base throughout the US
 - Elgin location is an appointment-only storefront, no warehouse
- Founded by Verónica Ramos
 - When she was a ESL teacher, she saw a need for Spanish-language materials for kids
- Currently supplies books in 24 languages for ages baby to adult
- Spanish books come from all over Latin America

Book quality

-

- Staff live across the globe and can navigate logistics, cultural differences, and political climate
 - Staff receives the books, inspects them , then ships to libraries
 - Shipping cost is from ¡Wepa! to library
- Books are authentic, written by authors from the country of origin
- Books also need to have vibrant covers

Client Success Manager

- Collaborates with libraries to create collection
- Needs to know where the international community is from
 - New to the US or second generation and beyond?
- Can give advice on displays and social media posts to promote materials

Standing order vs custom picks program

- Standing order
 - Planned at the beginning of the fiscal year
 - Create a contract with a budget schedule
 - o jWepa! takes their payment at the beginning of the contract
- Custom picks

- o ¡Wepa! will work on library's timeline
- Good for those who don't want a full-year contract
- ¡Wepa! will send a list of titles to choose
- Either via a customized showroom web page or a requested spreadsheet
 - If library chooses not to order after viewing showroom, they have to pay \$65/hour for its creation
- Have to request ISBNs
- For both: ¡Wepa! doesn't create MARC records

Insight + program

- Optional add on
- Curated selection
- Annual reports on circulation and engagement
- Data-driven title recommendations
- Collection evolution monitoring and diversity tracking
- Quarterly online staff training

Ordering process

- ¡Wepa! gathers information during a consultation (in-person or virtual)
 - Gets circ data from library to see what has been going out
- Provides a quote
 - Will accept either a signed quote or a purchase order
 - Minimum order \$400, depending on countries of origin
- Custom collection is curated, imported, inspected, and shipped
 - Shipping time depends on country of origin; can be sent in stages
 - Spanish shipping: Up to six weeks
 - Ukrainian, Russian, and Arabic shipping: Up to 10 weeks
 - Longest time has been 12 weeks
- Invoice sent with shipment
 - o Net 30 terms

About Polonia Bookstore

- Chicago-based since 1969
- Polish bookstore; expanding to include Ukrainian
- Offers wide range of genres
 - o Can also schedule a Zoom meeting

Placing an order

_

- Need to register as a customer on Polonia's website
 - Need to contact Polonia before placing an order
 - o Will receive an email address to their special list

- Libraries receive 20% discount on books and are tax exempt
- If a book isn't listed online, email books@polonia.com
 - They will check if the book is attainable
- Can pay online with a credit card, PayPal, or PO number
- Orders usually take 10 15 days for delivery
 - Shipment will include the invoice
- Polonia also does standing orders and custom orders via email

Topic #3: Guadalajara International Book Fair (FIL)

Presenter: Rebecca Jensen, Youth Services, Cook Memorial Public Library

About FIL

- Largest Spanish-language book fair
- In 2024: 1,769 publishers and 925,000 attendees

Why attend

- Access to books that aren't available in the US
 - Essential for building a collection that represents the community
 - Look at geographic diversity of existing Spanish collection
 - Some MARC records include place of publication
 - ISBNs also have a one three-digit <u>country code</u> that follows 978- or 979-
 - Note: Publishers may publish in different locations
- Opportunity to see the physical book before purchasing
- Books at FIL come from all over Latin America

Working with a US distributor

- Makes job easier at fair
- Simplifies receiving and processing for Acquisitions and Tech Services
 - Some distributors may create MARC records
- Distributors are experts in Spanish publishing and can guide
- Distributors will also act as language translator
- Book distributors
 - o <u>Cinco Books</u>
 - o Tomo Books
 - o <u>Lorito Books</u>
 - o <u>Lectorium</u>
 - o Chulainn Publishing Corp

Purchasing on your own

- Walk up to each publisher's stand
- Purchase using a credit card
- Have to carry the books around
