SUBJECT: Executive Director Report – May, 2021

Promote, support, and expand resource sharing to optimize use of tax dollars and other funding and help libraries share resources to the fullest extent possible

COVID 19 developments – Vaccines and Masks

We have been discussing policy and procedure changes as a result of the new CDC guidelines on masks and the general availability of vaccines. We are working on a policy about staff vaccination requirements and guidelines, and discussing staff returning to offices. We are awaiting Julie Tappendorf's specific guidance for us. Of course, policy changes will be submitted to the Policy Committee and then to the full board, but we want to have all of our facts straight, first. Department heads will be returning to the office, at least one day a week, starting now.

There are many questions from members, of course, and we are discussing possible member updates, a joint program with ILA and IHLS to share information and updates to our website.

East Peoria buildings update

I emailed the board on May 4 about the unexpected news that we have to vacate our East Peoria buildings. At this point, we have identified a potential property on Sabrina Drive, just across the highway from the current location. We are working to determine what buildout and other work we need to do before we can move in. We know that we will have to update the cabling, at least, and are awaiting pricing and negotiating with the owner on what expenses they might take on. This situation is changing rapidly so I will certainly have more information at the board meeting, but we do think we have found a solution that will work for both RSA and delivery.

E-resources update

Amazon has signed an agreement with DPLA to sell their ebooks to libraries via the DPLA Exchange. This is tremendous news. We are still evaluating the many possible effects this will have on libraries as well as on our ebook program.

We had begun to explore alternatives to Baker and Taylor's Axis 360 platform for ERead but at this point have concluded that Axis 360 is still our best solution. Their services to school libraries, especially the scoping feature that enables school libraries to focus their collections on age appropriate materials and curriculum related materials, are not available through other vendors.

We will now begin an analysis of the effectiveness of Biblioboards as a platform. Leila Heath will be working with Grant and Anna Behm on this study. We want to be sure that we are getting the best value for the taxpayers, of course. Biblioboard materials are also available through the DPLA exchange, so that may be a factor in our deliberations.

Advocacy issues for the board to promote and support

We have added a new feature for the board, talking points for the Service of the Month. This month that service is Explore More Illinois and the talking points are included in the packet.

As we promised last month, you will see the "megaphone" icon in *This Month at RAILS*, identifying additional advocacy talking points.

IMLS is continuing to have discussions with Congressional members and staff about including libraries in the infrastructure bill that is currently being considered by Congress. There are also ongoing discussions among IMLS and state libraries about funds for libraries.

Certification update

Certification has concluded successfully. We will have a debrief meeting with ISL and IHLS next week and will report to the board on findings.

Continuing education analysis

Joe and Grant have been working on an evaluation of our CE services and programs. We expect the work to be done soon.

Directors University

This program continues to be extremely successful. This year, we have 40 directors attending, almost equally divided between IHLS and RAILS. This number is lower than in previous years because some “new” directors moved from other director positions and had even attended DU previously.

Prepare libraries for the future

Equity, Diversity and Inclusion update

The board EDI committee continues to move forward and subcommittees have identified projects. We will be meeting with Biz next week to discuss the development of a library cohort to be part of our training. Libraries are extremely interested in access to EDI training and we think the cohort is the best methodology to provide the training.

The Nominating Committee meets on Monday, May 24 to confirm the results of the election and discuss the slate of officers for next year. Kathy Parker, Chair of the Nominating Committee, will attend the board meeting to give a report and answer any questions.

SUBJECT: Action items from previous meeting and status report

Calendar update – Per your request, we have added CE related events and other meetings that might be of interest to board members.

FY 2022 budget and operational plan – The budget has been updated to include new information related to both revenues and expenditures. Jim’s budget narrative provides an excellent overview, as well as extensive detail, about the budget and its alignment with the strategic plan and ISL priorities.

Also, the Executive Committee met on May 14 to discuss the budget in detail and voted to recommend that the proposed budget be submitted to the full board for approval. In the packet, you will find a memo and steps we will take during FY22 to address the structural deficit. I have not provided a list of possible cuts as was suggested last time, rather, this approach gives us time to identify reductions in expenses, internal restructuring and revenue increases, and then make cuts if necessary.

Strategic planning proposals – We received two additional proposals, one of which was subsequently withdrawn due to timing issues for the consultant, and another that was quite expensive. We believe that Stephanie Chase is the best person to guide our planning work. I have asked her to attend the June board meeting to discuss the process.

Statewide database proposal – The bill has been re-referred to the House Rules committee and appears to be “stuck.”

RAILS E-Book Grant Update

RAILS continues to purchase K-12 content for our [eRead Illinois](#) Axis 360 shared collection through [e-book grant](#) funds awarded by the Illinois State Library (ISL) last fall. The table below shows expenditures as of May 1. We submitted the first Quarterly Financial and Narrative Report to ISL, including a request for reimbursement of First Quarter expenses of \$55,609.12.

RAILS is on track to complete spending in June 2021. We continue to receive suggestions for titles to purchase with grant funds; eRead members can make suggestions [via this form](#).

Streamlined eRead Illinois Renewal Process Continues

[eRead Illinois Axis 360](#) renewals continue via a streamlined, automated process. As of May 11, 265 (64%) of participating libraries have renewed. To support this time of increased demand for electronic resources, RAILS is offering complimentary immediate access to new subscribers until the renewal start date of July 1.



RAILS libraries of all types are invited to join eRead Illinois for very affordable access to e-books. It can serve as the library's primary e-book collection, or augment existing e-book collections. For more information on joining and a fee estimate, libraries can visit the [eRead website](#).

E-Resources Networking/Promotional Activities

RAILS hosted an e-content networking meeting on April 26. Libraries discussed OverDrive's recent acquisition of RBDigital's services, including digital magazines. There was also a short discussion of RAILS's [OpenGov story](#) about the impact of the pandemic on library e-content usage. RAILS is planning on updating this analysis later this spring.

Explore More Illinois Update

Improving Physical Delivery Services

Delivery RFP and Timeline

On May 11, RAILS released an [RFP for delivery and sorting services](#). We are seeking proposals from service providers to provide an efficient and cost-effective long-term delivery strategy. A wide variety of options are open for proposals including sorting, delivery, shuttle services, and mail forwarding services. The RFP was created with the assistance of Greg Pronevitz, the consultant RAILS has been working with to help us plan for the future of delivery.

RDA (Resource Description & Access) is an international standard for the creation of library and cultural heritage metadata. [RDA Toolkit](#)'s subscription-based online platform allows catalogers from all library sizes and types to access RDA's data elements, guidelines, and instructions for creating their metadata. A [free 30 day trial](#) is available. New sign-ups and renewals for the RAILS group purchase are due by June 1.

Career Online High School (COHS)/Smart Horizons Career Online Education (SHCOE)

RAILS is finalizing the transfer of [COHS](#) from Gale to SHCOE. SHCOE, the company that has always handled the educational component of the program, will now take over administrative, financial, and marketing aspects as well. Staff attended COHS training with the new vendor on May 13 and attended a COHS Network Meeting for RAILS/IHLS program participants on May 4.

ConsortiaManager Implementation Continues

RAILS has started gathering data for the migration to ConsortiaManager, an online resource that will help us increase efficiency, capacity, and member communications related to our group purchases. We expect this phase of the project to take several weeks. RAILS will also have access to the Consortia Manager User Group and over 40 other subscribers worldwide.

Sharing Best Practices with Consortia Purchasing Managers Nationwide

Leila Heath, Library Resources and Programs Manager, met with a group of Consortia Purchasing Managers from [Califa \(California\)](#), [Midwest Collaborative for Library Services](#) (Michigan), [OhioNet](#), and the [Florida Academic Library Services Cooperative](#) on April 22. The group discussed issues and procedures related to purchasing across large, multitype consortia. They plan to meet again in June.

In October 2020, RAILS recruited 11 members from all four library types (academic, public, school, and specialized) to work on a variety of activities related to our [My Library Is...](#)

[campaign](#). The My Library Is... Advisory Team hit the ground running and has been helping us publicize the campaign to other RAILS members ever since.

They recently initiated three new projects:

- Infographics – creating hands-on events to help libraries learn how to produce infographics and use low-cost/free design tools
- Image library – creating a central platform for libraries to upload/download stock images of libraries
- Marketing newsletter – creating a regular newsletter featuring My Library Is... content and marketing tips for libraries

Work on these projects will continue through the summer. A special thank you to Shandi Greve Penrod from the Illinois Heartland Library System (IHLS), who recently started working with the group. We expect to add participants from ILHS member libraries soon.
