#### **Associate Executive Director Report**

### Provides leadership in ensuring sustainable, equitable resource sharing

Deirdre and I focused on the new **Strategic Plan** in the newest episode of <u>Sparks</u>, the RAILS podcast. We cover the strategy of picking a consultant, helpful virtual tools, member feedback, and more about the nuances of conducting a strategic planning process during a pandemic.

The LLSAP Sustainability Working Group (LSWG) is continuing to meet. Illinois Heartland Library System (IHLS) Executive Director Leslie Bednar also led a meeting on February 22 that on focused on exploring the future of statewide resource sharing. Representatives from IHLS, the Illinois State Library (ISL), and RAILS attended, along with representatives from CARLI, CCS, SHARE, SWAN, Pinnacle, PrairieCat, Rock River, and RSA. There was continued discussion about the possibility of exploring a statewide ILS. The RAILS Board Consortia Committee LLSAP Sustainability Working Group is now seeking proposals from consultants interested in conducting an assessment into which multitype resource sharing among Illinois libraries could be done more efficiently. RAILS is offering a continuing education program originally suggested by the RAILS Board Equity Diversity and Inclusion committee, **Upstander Intervention in Action**, on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>March 16</u>. This interactive workshop will help attendees to build awareness and provide tools for safe and effective ways to stand up and intervene.

I've had the privilege of attending all but one of the recent series of **ILA Legislative meetups**. It was wonderful to hear all the inspiring and innovative stories that ILA compiled from all around Illinois. Many legislators expressed support for Illinois libraries and the legislative initiatives shared by ILA. Both legislators and attendees expressed hope that the meetups can return to in person next year. Huge thanks to the RAILS Board members who attended these events this winter.

# Leads alongside member libraries to develop and strengthen Illinois library community

In Illinois legislative news, **Senate Bill 3497**, which amends the Illinois Local Library Act and the Public Library District Act of 1991 to allow library boards to adopt regulations waiving the nonresident fee for persons under the age of 18, passed out of the Senate with a 52-0 vote in late February. It now moves to the House with a hearing expected for mid-March. The bill, which was originally introduced by Senator Laura Murphy, is not a mandate and allows for local control by boards to determine how they would like to approach the issue. It also allows for participation in expanded service by a board vote rather than relying on Intergovernmental agreements or requiring students to show paperwork confirming free or reduced lunch participation. If passed, the bill would be effective immediately.

Illinois Library Association (ILA) Executive Director Diane Foote announced her impending **retirement** earlier this week. Diane expressed her thanks and appreciation for a wonderful experience with ILA in a letter to the ILA membership on Monday, March 7<sup>th</sup>. She has noted that the ILA Executive Committee and full Executive Board will begin to discuss a smooth transition plan this month. We are thankful to Diane Foote for her leadership and partnership with RAILS and on behalf of all Illinois libraries. She will be missed and we wish her all the best.

At the board meeting we will also introduce Elena Mendoza, who has recently joined RAILS as a **staff accountant**. We also have programs on our Explore More Illinois program with Jessica Barnes and Dan Bostrom and Halle Cox will give us an overview of the current view for special libraries.

Looking ahead to April, we will have development presentations about OERs (Open Educational Resources) with Jennifer McIntosh and Dr. Denise Coate and RAILS Discounts and Group Purchase programs.

Applicants will be asked to demonstrate the impact their projects will have on their diverse student populations, teachers, parents, and administrators. The application deadline is April 18, 2022.

#### RAILS Engages School Library Staff at IDEAcon Conference

Nicole Zimmermann, Marketing & Public Relations Specialist, and Anna Behm, E-Content Specialist, staffed the RAILS booth at the <u>IDEAcon</u> (Illinois Digital Educators Alliance Conference) in Schaumburg in February. They engaged with approximately 120 visitors, including teachers and technology staff who were very interested to learn more about RAILS and who promised to bring the information back to their school librarian.

#### **RAILS Presence at Kane County Institute Day**

Dan Bostrom, RAILS Member Engagement Manager, staffed a table at the March 4 Kane County Institute Day. The one-day teacher training event is run by the Kane County Regional Office of Education and provided an opportunity for RAILS to connect with teachers, principals, librarians, and other school staff about eRead Illinois, Inkie.org, continuing education, grants, and more.

#### ConsortiaManager Update

ConsortiaManager (CM) is an online resource designed specifically for consortia that will help RAILS increase efficiency, capacity, and member communications related to our group purchases. RAILS staff continue to build the content and supporting documents needed to create a robust site for those managing and participating in RAILS discount offerings.

Our CM vendor made several modifications to accommodate the complexity of the RAILS environment, including increasing processing speed, adding various filtering options and metadata fields, and reordering workflows to better reflect RAILS procedures. The build/customize process will continue through the spring.

### Career Online High School (COHS) Update

<u>Career Online High School</u> is an 18-credit, vocation-based high school completion program. The program enables libraries to offer adult learners accredited high school diplomas and career certificates in high-demand employment fields. Smart Horizons Career Online Education, the COHS vendor, recently added a Manufacturing Track to the Career Certificate Portfolio. RAILS subsidizes the cost of the platform.

<u>Find More Illinois</u> connects participating standalone and shared online catalogs. Library patrons can quickly search all these catalogs in a single search. Patrons and staff at participating libraries can also place interlibrary loan requests in the same



search session. The more libraries that participate in Find More Illinois, the more robust and complete a resource it will be. For this reason, RAILS wants to significantly grow the number of participating libraries.

Welcome to these libraries that recently joined Find More Illinois: DeKalb Public Library, Helen Plum Library (Lombard), Highwood Public Library, Knoxville Community Unit School District 200, Ohio Public Library District, Skokie Public Library, and Wheaton Public Library. In addition, the six libraries in the Pinnacle Library Cooperative are joining together: Fountaindale Public Library District, Joliet Public Library, Lemont Public Library District, Plainfield Public Library District, Shorewood-Troy Public Library District, and White Oak Library District.

### RAILS School Libraries Encouraged to Apply for My Library Is... Grant

Applications are now open for the 2022 My Library Is... Grants for School Libraries. These grants are designed to help school libraries tell their story and advance projects that will help them achieve maximum visibility in their schools and communities.

This is the second year these grants have focused on school libraries. In FY 2021, RAILS funded 14 projects at a total cost of over \$13,000. This year, we are raising the individual grant limit from \$1,000 to \$5,000. Applicants are also required to include a statement of equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI) in their application. The deadline is Monday, April 18, 2022.

#### March Meeting with AISLE, IHLS, and ILA

RAILS staff meet monthly with representatives from the Association of Illinois School Library Educators (AISLE), Illinois Heartland Library System (IHLS), and the Illinois Library Association (ILA) to discuss ways we can work collaboratively to support school libraries. Topics discussed at the March meeting included:
