Databases, Deals, and Discounts

ConsortiaManager Update

ConsortiaManager (CM) is an online resource designed specifically for consortia that will help RAILS increase efficiency, capacity, and member communications related to our group purchases. RAILS staff continue to build the content and supporting documents needed to create a robust site for those managing and participating in RAILS discount offerings.

Our CM vendor made several modifications to accommodate the complexity of the RAILS environment, including increasing processing speed, adding various filtering options and metadata fields, and reordering workflows to better reflect RAILS procedures. The build/customize process will continue through the spring.

Legal GPS Discount

RAILS negotiated advantageous pricing for [Legal GPS](#), an online resource that helps new and existing businesses “do legal” without having to hire a lawyer. Rural librarians describe it as a convenient way for entrepreneurs not living in large metropolitan areas to get legal help. Members can register for an [instant free trial](#).

EBSCO Deals, Trials, and Webinars

RAILS offers significantly discounted pricing for a variety of EBSCO products. Members can access trials and recordings of demos for K-12 and public libraries on the Deals & Discounts web page. The deadline for new sign-ups and renewals for all RAILS packages is June 10.

- [Prenda Code Club](#) helps libraries engage the "Coding-in-Libraries" movement through self-paced learn-to-code software for kids ages 8-18 and training and support for library staff to start code clubs.

Checkers Library TV is partnering with RAILS to offer deeply discounted pricing for “The Reading Road Trip,” a fun and educational program created as online and in-person programming exclusively for libraries. There is a choice of two eight-episode series, "Off-Road Adventures" or "Deep Sea Readers," that align with popular 2022 Summer Reading Themes. eRead Illinois News

Anna Behm, E-Content Specialist, hosted a March webinar presented by Baker & Taylor (our eRead Illinois vendor) about the new interactive dashboard feature in [Axis 360](#). About 25 people attended and a [recording is available](#) on the RAILS YouTube site.

Anna Behm also met with the new director and assistant at Toluca Public Library in early April to provide an overview of eRead Illinois Axis 360 and to discuss other RAILS programs/services.

RAILS continues to plan for the upcoming eRead Illinois Axis 360 renewal period. We sent initial renewal emails to library participants on April 11. Libraries interested in joining eRead Illinois will be able to do so without incurring a fee for the remainder of the current fiscal year (until July 1, 2022).

Explore More Illinois

RAILS is [running a contest](#) to encourage libraries to suggest attractions for [Explore More Illinois](#). Libraries can submit attraction suggestions through May 31. For every suggestion that results in an additional Explore More attraction by August 15, the library will receive one entry into a raffle for lunch for library staff. The Quipu Group, the Explore More software vendor, is sponsoring the contest.

We added our first two minor-league baseball teams in March. This month, we reached 41 attractions, the most attractions Explore More Illinois has ever had at one time. See [complete list](#) of attractions.

Illinois Central College (ICC) is working with RAILS on our community college pilot program. ICC has started marketing the program to students and staff. We also met with ICC's performing arts center director and art gallery director to discuss adding them as attractions to Explore More Illinois.

As of April 6, Illinois libraries participate in the program (323 RAILS and 84 IHLS member libraries).

[Find More Illinois](#) connects participating standalone and shared online catalogs. Library patrons can quickly search all these catalogs in a single search. All Illinois libraries are eligible to participate, regardless of their size, type, or library software. For libraries that join before March 2023, all setup fees are waived. No annual fees will be billed until July 1, 2023.

Welcome to these libraries that recently joined Find More Illinois: Antioch Public Library District, DeKalb Public Library, Helen Plum Library (Lombard), Highwood Public Library, Knoxville Community Unit School District 200, Ohio Public Library District, Skokie Public Library, and Wheaton Public Library. In addition, the six libraries in the Pinnacle Library Cooperative are joining together: Fountaindale Public Library District, Joliet Public Library, Lemont Public Library District, Plainfield Public Library District, Shorewood-Troy Public Library District, Waukegan Public Library, and White Oak Library District.

[Measuring the Impact of RAILS Continuing Education](#)

The RAILS CE team is using two new post-event surveys to gather meaningful feedback about our CE events. Working with RAILS Data Analysis Manager Grant Halter, our post-event survey asks questions specific to the CE category (HR, EDI, marketing, etc.) to identify the potential impacts of the training content. We are sending a second follow-up survey to willing participants approximately 3-4 weeks later to capture their recall of the event and to determine what tangible outcomes have occurred as a result of what they learned.

RSC FY2021 Goal 3: Provide Services for the Unserved

Universal Service/Unserved

Expanded Cards for Kids Act Passes Both Houses

Illinois Senate Bill 3497 (expanded Cards for Kids Act): Amends the Illinois Local Library Act and Public Library District Act of 1991. Provides that a library board may adopt regulations waiving the nonresident fee for persons under the age of 18. Removes language in the Illinois Local Library Act providing that nothing in the Section requires a public library to participate in the non-resident card reciprocal borrowing program of a regional library system.

Both of these bills await the governor's signature. The Illinois State Library will craft administrative rules to guide implementation in libraries.

Several other bills (including Illinois Library Association priorities HB4758 expanding access to Broadband and HB4470 on creating equitable access to e-books) are still being monitored as they move through the legislative process.
