Legislation

["Literacy and Justice for All Bill" \(SB2243\)](#)

- Work on the state Literacy plan preceded the legislation but aligns with the path forward.
- Requires a comprehensive statewide literacy plan to be adopted by January 31, 2024.
- Additional components of the legislation include:
 - Guidance and resources for developing local literacy plans, implementing evidence-based practices, screening tools, and early literacy interventions.
 - A rubric for evaluating literacy curriculum
 - Professional development

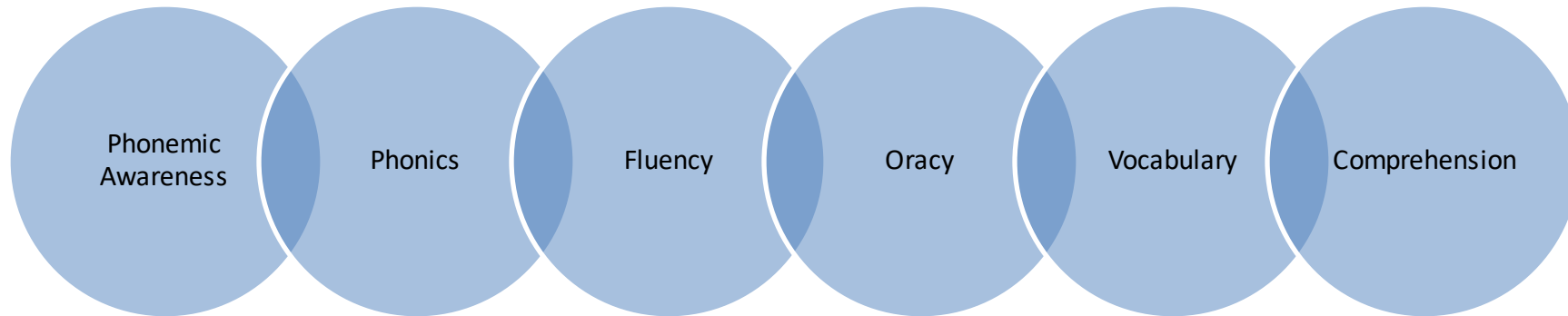

Framework for Effective Evidence-Based Literacy Instruction

 - Considerations for learners with special needs
 - Developmental trajectories for literacy, by age and grade level
 - Assessment to support literacy (universal screening, benchmarking, diagnostic assessments, progress monitoring, formative and summative assessments, and Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS))



Educator Professional Learning and Development

- This section addresses professional learning necessary to establish intentional, comprehensive, and coordinated approaches that promote equitable and positive literacy outcomes for all learners and considers the needs of:
 - Current and preservice teachers
 - School and teacher leaders
 - Professional development providers
 - Faculty at higher education institutions
- This section also includes information regarding:
 - Key considerations for development of professional learning
 - Training strategies for in-service educators
 - Learning outcomes for preservice teachers
 - Professional development content and audience prioritization
 - Connection to the specific literacy standards for endorsement in elementary education



Framework for Effective Leadership, Systems of Support & Implementation

- This section outlines how communities, families, teachers, and school-, district-, regional-, and state-level leadership can collaborate to support literacy development across the state. It explores
 - roles and responsibilities of different leaders
 - how to create a coherent and comprehensive system of support for literacy development
 - how leaders can cultivate a culture of literacy within our schools

 - Considerations for leaders at each level
 - Reflection questions
 - Recommended actions for implementation
