DiversiTEA Session at the 2023 ILA Annual Conference

This annual session is hosted by ILA's Diversity Committee, and showcases experts within and outside the library sector who share their insights, expertise, and exemplary approaches to foster a more diverse and inclusive world.

This year's speaker is Stephen Jackson, a motivational speaker, published author, advocate of restorative justice, licensed mental health counselor, and staunch proponent of equity and inclusion.

Serving as the Director of Equity and Anti-Racism at Oak Park Public Library, Jackson places high value on public service and the enrichment of lives by skillfully integrating restorative justice and restorative practices. The theme is "Restore, Renew, Reboot: Using Restorative Practices to Promote Organizational Well-Being" and it explores the intersection of diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) and restorative practices to better support and equip individuals with effective methods in engaging both staff and patrons to promote positive organizational growth and change.

The Illinois Library Association Mentorship Program provides mentorship and networking opportunities for emerging librarians. This program assists them in understanding industry and professional standards

and developing the skills needed to excel in the field. This can help to create a more level playing field for those just starting out.
