Executive Director Report, November 2023

Provides leadership in ensuring sustainable, equitable resource sharing

Illinois Library Association Annual Conference

We discussed briefly at our October meeting, but I want to reiterate what a great experience our RAILS team had at the ILA Annual Conference in Springfield from October 24-26. It was wonderful to see so many RAILS staff, Board members, and RAILS members presenting on many valuable topics. Our joint 10th Anniversary eRead Illinois Party with our sister system, Illinois Heartland Library System, at ILA Annual was a big success and it was a great chance to celebrate the success of that program. RAILS Director of Technology Anne Slaughter and IHLS IT Director Troy Brown presented at the ILA President's Program on the importance of the upcoming funding opportunities related to broadband and digital equity. Finally, it was just great to see so many at the RAILS booth and throughout the conference! It was a wonderful opportunity to continue to work together after a few challenging years in libraries. After attendance at the AISLE and ILA conferences this October I am really inspired by the work happening in the Illinois library community and I'm looking forward to our next steps together.

Public Act 103-0100

The most recent ISLAC (Illinois State Library Advisory Committee) meeting on November 1 included discussion of the Secretary of State's proposed amendments related to <u>Public Act 103-0100</u> prohibiting book banning. A discussion of the comments received (comment period ended in October) revealed that there are few changes anticipated before the act becomes effective on January 1. Since one potential avenue for compliance with the act is for libraries and library systems to adopt the ALA Bill of Rights, we've prepared a resolution for the Board to consider that you will find in your packet. Looking forward to the discussion at the meeting.

RAILS Minute

The most recent <u>RAILS Minute</u> focused on several current topics, including our upcoming Member Update, a new EDI resource for RAILS members called Freedom Lifted, and the My Library Is... grant opportunity that is now available for all types of libraries. Thanks to Digital Marketing and Communications Specialist Ola Gronski and Marketing and Communications Director Dan Bostrom for all their continued work on this offering.

Models best practices in equity, diversity, accessibility, and inclusion

Equity Analysis for the RAILS Personnel Manual

Our EDI consultant Biz Lindsay-Ryan has completed her initial review of our personnel manual, with an eye to potential changes we may want to consider based on an equity lens. Associate Executive Director Joe Filapek, HR Manager Samantha Daly, and I met with Biz on October 12 and 31 to review her comments. There were many useful comments which we plan to incorporate into our forthcoming review of personnel policies with the RAILS Board Policy Committee.

Assist member libraries in preparing for the future

RAILS Member Update on November 15

Now that we have our new Marketing and Communications Director in place, we're looking forward to our first RAILS Member Update in some time! Please join us on Zoom on Wednesday, November 15 at 1pm for a series of updates relevant to RAILS members. Topics covered will include an overview of Freedom Lifted, Broadband in Illinois, updates on Public Act 103-100 and statewide online resources from the Illinois State Library, and new My Library Is... grant opportunities. We hope to be able to offer member updates more frequently moving forward.

RSA (Resource Sharing Alliance) Independence Project

Work towards independence from RAILS for RSA has been in progress since at least 2019, but as we enter a new phase of that active development we wanted to offer the RAILS Board an update about how those efforts are moving along. Associate Executive Director Joe Filapek and I met on November 2 with RSA Executive Director Kendal Orrison, RSA Board President Alissa Williams, and Amanda Standerfer of Standerfer Consulting to discuss a communication plan for the next steps of the project. We came up with some great next steps for our shared communications plan. We will discuss the project in more detail at the November RAILS Board meeting.

Library Journal Directors Summit and Pre-Conference on Library Safety and Security

As I write this, I am currently attending the Library Journal Directors Summit in Houston, Texas (November 8-10). I elected to attend the preconference on Library Safety and Security to make connections with library leaders and experts on best practice around safety in our libraries after the efforts around responding to a series of bomb threats in RAILS member libraries this summer. I've also heard many interesting strategies for addressing materials challenges from library leaders in states that have significant legislative challenges around materials, programs, and services. It is a truly inspiring group and I've learned a lot in my time here. I am grateful to the RAILS Board for the opportunity to attend and the staff who are keeping things moving forward at RAILS in my absence from the office.

Leads alongside member libraries to develop and strengthen Illinois library community

Joint Board meeting with Illinois Heartland Library System

We are meeting with administrative staff from Illinois Heartland Library System later this month to discuss planning for a joint Board meeting for RAILS and IHLS in late Spring 2024. It has been about a decade since the last joint Board meeting, and many RAILS Board members over the years have suggested their hopes to meet together again to discuss shared goals and challenges that we can work on together. I am very interested in your comments about what topics you would be interested in covering with the IHLS Board as we plan for this meeting. More details are forthcoming as our planning comes together.

Illinois State Library Advisory Committee (ISLAC)

The ISLAC Committee met for the first time since May 2023 on November 1. I attended the meeting virtually as a guest. Topics discussed included the selection of a Chair and Vice Chair (Dave Barry and Stacey Carter, respectively), the Secretary of State's budget, Broadband, the License to Read Act, statewide databases for libraries, open educational resources (OER), and a draft document for certification that details how libraries will respond to their obligations under Public Act 103-100, and future agenda building. Greg McCormick will join us at the November meeting to share more information about some of these items. Towards the end of the meeting, Greg McCormick mentioned that the Secretary's office is finalizing their process for appointing members of the committee and they hope to have an update regarding that soon.

Illinois Library Association Public Policy Committee (PPC)

The ILA PPC committee met on Monday, November 6. Many updates to the current <u>legislative priorities</u> were discussed. A bill has already been filed related to the treasurer bond reduction from 50% to 10% or operating budget, which was a proposal introduced this year by RAILS. An increase in the current (\$25,000) competitive bidding threshold is also being proposed. There was an additional discussion about bringing the Local Records Act discussion to the Secretary of State's office rather than pursue it as a legislative change. A recent change was made to the regular PPC agenda where ex officio organizations (including RAILS) offer a brief update of their organizations at each meeting.

Illinois Library Association Legislative Meetups

ILA is hosting seven in person legislative meetups in late November and early December. This is the first time these events have been in person since 2020. RAILS staff members will attend all events covering RAILS member territory from November 29 through December 6. We encourage RAILS Board members to attend one of these events. Please note that registration closes on November 24 and no in site registration will be available.

Deals & Discounts Webinars/Demos

In October, RAILS Library Resource Specialist Jody Rubel organized and hosted two readers' advisory resource webinars for 15 attendees. A recording of the webinar is available on the Deals & Discounts page. The promotion resulted in two new library sign ups that resulted in \$548 total savings.

Jody Rubel continues to receive quote requests and new signups for the movie performance rights licenses and digital newspapers and magazines offers. More than 33% of the currently subscribing libraries have renewed their movie performance rights licenses. The group purchase sign-up and renewal period ends on November 30. While at the ILA Conference October 24-26 in Springfield, IL both Jody Rubel and Leila Health met vendors to discuss and strengthen the Deals & Discounts offers to our members, and to explore potential opportunities. Two of our vendor partners were first time exhibitors at the conference.

ConsortiaManager & Data Management

On October 17, RAILS Director of Library Resources and Programs Leila Heath and Jody Rubel attended the Consortia Manager user group meeting to learn more about recent enhancements and development roadmap. About 60 consortia now subscribe to ConsortiaManager, both in the US and internationally.

Leila Heath and Jenny Taylor, Associate Director of E-Resources at CARLI, met on October 19 to discuss issues and procedures pertaining to consortial group purchasing.

On November 2, Anna Behm, Jody Rubel, and Leila Heath met with Karen Gover and Wayne Dixon to discuss details and progress for the new software platform for managing eRead Illinois subscriptions.

Delivery Vehicle Update

On August 22, 2023, RAILS was able to order two Ford F350 box trucks with a 12' box from Landmark Ford via the Illinois Department of Central Management Services (CMS).

On October 27, 2023, RAILS successfully ordered seven 2024 Ford Transit vehicles at a cost of \$54,246 each. We will share more details about the arrival timeline of those vehicles when that becomes available. We are also looking to order more Ford F450/550 box trucks as well.

The total for the nine vehicles ordered amounts to \$502,250.00. The total amount budgeted for vehicles this fiscal year was \$750,000.00 therefore leaving adequate room to purchase the additional vehicles required.

Work collaboratively to identify and support shared catalog solutions and expand resource sharing

Catalog Membership Grant

Applications for the Catalog Membership Grant have been received from three libraries joining shared catalog consortia. Awards will be announced later in November.

FY 2025 LLSAP Support Grants

Awards for the FY 2025 LLSAP Support Grants have been announced to the six shared catalog consortia, or Local Library System Automation Programs (LLSAPs) within RAILS. This annual grant distributes \$2.25 million of funding to support the operations of CCS, PrairieCat, Rock River Library Consortium, RSA, SWAN, and Pinnacle Library consortium and their considerable contributions to resource sharing across the RAILS service area.

Find More Illinois Update

Find More Illinois was part of the conversation at the 2023 ILA Annual Conference. Participating panelists in "Expanding Library Service Across Illinois with Resource Sharing" included RAILS staff, librarians from Find More Illinois libraries, and a member of RAILS' Board of Directors. Some of the topics discussed



included ways to share resources, the benefits of sharing resources, and how to support small libraries by sharing resources.

eRead Illinois Update

Burr Ridge Office Changes




