Executive Director Report, August 2024

Provides leadership in ensuring sustainable, equitable resource sharing

RAILS Member Update is Coming on September 4th

We hope you can join us for RAILS Member Update on September 4that 3pm. The meeting will focus on a presentation from Greg McCormick and Suzanna Jones from the Illinois State Library about the Statewide e-Resource Package, a report on how libraries of all types can advocate for school libraries from AISLE Executive Secretary Carolyn Kinsella, and an overview of the Agencies of Impact data report from RAILS' Janette Derucki.

Illinois Legislative Updates

The FY2025 Illinois Library Association (ILA) Public Policy Committee (PPC) met on August 5 to review legislative proposals received by that committee. RAILS submitted a joint proposal with IHLS on better access to the internet for libraries that would align them with what is made available to schools in Illinois. PPC asked for the proposal to be combined with a similar proposal that was received by the committee, and Anne Slaughter of RAILS and Troy Brown of IHLS have agreed to work on combining the proposals. This should come back before the committee at our next meeting on August 26. I have also volunteered to participate in a new subcommittee that will evaluate other legislative asks from other units of government to identify future opportunities for Illinois libraries.

Site Visits to RAILS Board Member Libraries

I've been able to visit RAILS Board members at Byron Public Library, Frankfort Public Library, and Clarendon Hills Public Library this month. Thank you so much for the tours, hospitality, and thoughtful conversations about what you hope to receive from your RAILS Board experience. I'm looking forward to a visit to the Homewood Public Library soon! If any of you would like me to come for site visit, let Emily know and we would be happy to arrange it whenever it is convenient for you.

Evaluating Delivery Options

RAILS has recently received a series of quotes from our outsourced delivery and sorting provider, CTS, related to an upcoming contract renewal. We are currently evaluating the options presented and will share more during our delivery presentation in September.

Models best practices in equity, diversity, accessibility, and inclusion

Climate Team

The RAILS Climate Team resumed meeting in August after a brief pause over the summer months. Topics discussed included details of an upcoming staff survey related to learning around EDI principles and discussion of how to eventually move from being facilitated by an outside subject expert to a self-governed climate team.

IMLS Grant with Dominican University Selected for Funding

Dominican University's IMLS grant (on which we are partners) for *Exploring User-Informed Approaches to Enhancing Library Metadata for the LBGTQ+ Community* has been selected for funding. We look forward to supporting them as a partner in the project.

Assist member libraries in preparing for the future

Continuing Education (CE) Event Grants

We've just launched our next grant initiative available to RAILS member libraries through continuing education. RAILS members can shape future professional development opportunities by applying for up to \$2000 in funding per grant to support continuing education initiatives for library workers and trustees. While we prioritize CE events centered around equity, diversity, inclusion, and accessibility we're open to applications covering topics that benefit our library communities. There are two deadlines for FY2025: October 1 and February 3. You can find out more and apply at the <u>CE Event Grants</u> web page.

Agencies of Impact Report

As I know you are all aware, a lot of planning went into the Agencies of Impact data report that Janette Derucki will present on at the August meeting. One of our strategic plan goals is to help member libraries of all types and sizes demonstrate their value to their various stakeholders. We hope this report can be one more advocacy tool as they tell their library story to their communities. You can access an online and accessible version of <u>Agencies of Impact</u> on the My Library Is.. website, and we will be sending print copies to member libraries soon. Looking forward to your ideas about how we can continue to help libraries to demonstrate their value. We will also present on the report at the ILA Annual conference in October.

Statewide e-Resource Package

The Illinois State Library has sent communications to RAILS member libraries detailing the steps they should take to ensure access to the statewide e-resource package. This includes details of what is in the e-resource package, how to get access, and why libraries should take the time to get access set up. As reported earlier, the ISL will also present on this topic at our September Member Update.

Leads alongside member libraries to develop and strengthen Illinois library community

iCamp (Illinois Cataloging Mentorship Program) Launches

A new year-long initiative designed to support all levels of current and aspiring cataloging staff launched at the end of July. Over twelve months participants will engage in monthly meetings between new professionals and seasoned mentors focused on connection, goal setting, and shared expectations. The program emphasizes the advancement of cataloging skills, networking opportunities, and the establishment of lasting professional relationships. This program is the result of a partnership between RAILS and the Illinois Heartland Library System.

Directors University

I had the opportunity to attend one day of the 8th Annual Directors University (July 30-Aug 1) in Bloomington, Illinois. Directors University is a professional development opportunity intended for first-time library directors and directors new to Illinois from public libraries of all shapes and sizes. I gave a joint presentation with IHLS Executive Director Leslie Bednar on understanding the value of the library systems, and helping library directors understand what they could get from system support. This program, co-sponsored by IHLS, the Illinois Library Association, the Illinois State Library, and RAILS, continues to be a very important opportunity for ensuring well trained library support across Illinois.

Illinois School Library Workers Symposium on September 25

We invite school library staff to join us for the 2nd annual Illinois School Library Workers Symposium on September 25, from 8:30am to 3pm. This is a full day of online training for school library workers provided by RAILS, AISLE, ILA, and IHLS at no cost to individuals or school districts. Applications to attend are being accepted through August 30.

Free People Read Freely: Literacy, Inclusion and Democracy on August 20-21

CARLI (Consortium of Academic and Research Libraries in Illinois) will host a Symposium August 20-21 that will feature speakers and panel discussions on topics including book banning, censorship, and the importance of reading and books to foster public dialogue. RAILS will have an information table at this event and Associate Executive Director Joe Filapek will represent RAILS throughout the event.

eRead Illinois & Inkie.org Update

eRead Illinois renewals concluded in July and all member libraries were invoiced for their FY25 subscription. 100% of eRead Illinois member library membership fees go directly to purchasing materials for the eRead Illinois collection. In FY24, we added over 13,500 ebooks and audiobooks.



RAILS staff are working on a package of promotional materials that will be sent to all participating eRead Illinois libraries. This will arrive in the coming weeks.

The eRead Illinois newsletter went out in July. This newsletter goes out quarterly to eRead Illinois member libraries and includes helpful reminders and tips. This most recent edition gave libraries an update about the eRead Illinois renewal process, a link to the YouTube video for RAILS Data Intern Quinn McKissock's presentation about eRead Illinois data, and links to helpful resources. The next eRead Illinois newsletter will be sent in October.

Far and away the most popular module of the Inkie.org Library this month were the RAILS Community Collections. These collections include materials that RAILS library have created and contributed to the Inkie.org Library. Examples of community collections include community recipe collections, high school yearbooks, and historical photograph collections. In July, RAILS Community Collections account for 1,600 of the 1,900 views of the Inkie.org Library.

RAILS Partners in Dominican University IMLS Grant Project

Dominican University's School of Information Studies, along with two other library schools, was recently awarded a 2024 National Leadership Grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). The title of their grant project is <u>Exploring User-Informed Approaches to Enhancing Library Metadata for the LGBTQ+</u> <u>Community</u>. This grant project will examine how adult LGBTQ+ library users understand and make use of the library catalog and how metadata might be improved to reflect the needs of these users. As a grant partner, RAILS will support this project by promoting opportunities for member libraries to recruit users from their community to participate in user studies and focus groups.

• "Making Your Website More Accessible", webinar, July 24

In this introductory webinar, Laura Solomon briefly discussed the legal landscape, and then broke down some concrete actions and changes you can make to your website's content now to make it more accessible in the short term. In this webinar participants learned what "web accessibility" covers, understood which legal standards apply to library websites, and took away at least three changes that can be made to make a website more accessible to people with disabilities.

- "A Day in the Life of a Special Librarian", webinar, July 30
 Colby Maddox, Resource Center Manager at Old Town School of Folk Music, gave a brief history of Old
 Town School of Folk Music and its Resource Center, the Resource Center's catalog conversion,
 approaches to shelf arrangement, balancing archival needs with the needs of the library, revenue
 streams that fit a special library, and more.
- "Increasing Digital Health & Equity Through Telehealth", webinar series, August 1
 In this two-part series, Heartland Forward used their experience collaborating with The Public Library
 Association to create <u>Getting Started with Telehealth</u>, a new training module available on
 <u>DigitalLearn.org</u>, to give an overview of telehealth services and taught participants how to use the
 training module to help their patrons.
- **"Budgeting in Tough Times for Small Libraries**", webinar, August 6 This webinar was designed for small library directors and board members seeking to enhance their financial strategies. They learned crucial topics such as budget optimization, maximizing levy revenue, effective cost management, and more.
- "Project Management for the Rest of Us", Mount Prospect Public Library, August 7
 Early- to mid-level library professionals learned the key components of project management including
 how to start, planning essentials, execution, and closure, and how to communicate with management
 and stakeholders throughout the process.

- "Generative AI Tools for Creating Multimedia", webinar, September 10
 In this tour of multimedia generative AI tools, you'll be introduced to the underlying technology that allows images to be created from simple text inputs. You'll see demonstrations of tools for creating images, video, speech, and music, and examples of what these tools can generate. We'll discuss the ethical issues around training data, and the problem of "deepfakes." Finally, we'll offer ideas for how to use these tools for educational purposes.

Applications are due in mid-September and awards will be announced in late October. Reports on their use of FY24 LLSAP Support Grants are included in the meeting packet.

August Partnership Meeting

RAILS has monthly meetings with representatives from the Association of Illinois School Library Educators (AISLE), Chicago Public Schools (CPS), Illinois Heartland Library System (IHLS), Illinois Library Association (ILA), and the Illinois State Library (ISL) to discuss ways we can work collaboratively to support school libraries.

Illinois Cataloging Services Receives Acclaim at ALA Annual Conference



The words "public library" mean different things to people from different countries—that's why Highwood Library & Community Center emphasizes its purpose right in its name.

51% of Highwood residents speak Spanish and 30% have recently migrated to the community A growing need for mental health services became more obvious during the COVID-19 pandemic and after the neiphoring Highbard Park parade shooting in 2022. After years of virtual socialization, teens lacked spaces in real life where they could be themselves.

Today, all information in the library is available in English and Spanish and 80% of the staff are bilingual. Counselors are on staff and provide sessions in cozy, private rooms. Teens have a declicated space to create art, play games, and read for fun. Kids play make-believe on stage, complete with costumes available at their fingertips.

The Highwood Library staff work hard each day to create a home away from home for every person in the community.
