#### WHAT IS WORLD LANGUAGE CATALOGING SERVICES PROGRAM?

- RAILS World Language Cataloging Service is a valuable statewide resource for Illinois libraries of all types, offering original and copy cataloging for materials in world languages, including English, that are part of the library's regular collection.
- Illinois State library grant program. This program is not part of the ACP grant. No cost to libraries.
- Supports cataloging of most print and physical audiovisual (AV) materials in all languages included in a library's regular collection.
- Does **not** cover electronic resources, digital collections, or special collections.
- To participate, submit the electronic request form (<a href="https://railslibraries.org/catalogs/world-lang-form">https://railslibraries.org/catalogs/world-lang-form</a>) available on the RAILS website.
- Libraries may submit materials via physical items, photocopies, images, or PDF files.

#### HOW THE PROGRAM SUPPORTS YOUR LIBRARY?

- **Enhance Resource Sharing:** By ensuring materials are cataloged and discoverable, libraries can better share resources within the library network.
- **Support Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion:** The program enables libraries to serve non-native English speakers and multilingual communities more effectively.
- Expand Access to World Language Materials: Cataloging support for materials in all languages encourages libraries to include non-English titles in their collections.
- **Promote Cultural Inclusivity:** Libraries are empowered to acquire materials that reflect a broader range of cultures, voices, and perspectives.
- Remove Barriers to Acquiring Diverse Materials: Libraries often hesitate to purchase world language
  materials due to uncertainty about the availability of OCLC records. Without catalog records, these materials
  are not accessible to patrons. This program eliminates that barrier by providing cataloging support regardless
  of language or record availability.

#### PROGRAM GROWTH & STATISTICS

An ongoing surge in interest and demand for our cataloging program underscores its crucial significance for libraries throughout Illinois. The World Language Cataloging Services Program has seen impressive growth from 2022 to the present:

- Items Cataloged: FY 2022 saw 69 items cataloged; as of this month, we had 1,044 items in FY 2025!
- Libraries Participating: FY 2022 had 16 participating libraries; FY 2025 expanded to 40 libraries!
- Languages Cataloged: FY 2022 began with 13 languages; FY 2025 has grown to 27 languages cataloged!
