Lake Forest Academy serves 452 students, about half live on campus as Lake Forest is also a boarding school. Lake Forest serves students in grades 9-12. Students have the option to board or be a day student. Librarians Ashley Kolovitz and Rita MacAyeal serve the students of Lake Forest. The school English department hosts author visits, and an author series. All freshmen students take digital media literacy class for one semester with a librarian and then follow up as sophomores with lessons about mis- and dis-information. The librarians offer push-in instructional literacy, workshops on how to use maker tools, and social activities. Rita runs the school book club and archive club, and Ashley also teaches yoga. They also have a faculty and staff book club. They have also work on digital displays and book recommendations. The librarians are interested in discounts, networking, and professional development. Discounts on databases are welcome. They are very excited about joining RAILS and are also going to plug RAILS membership to their independent schools network.
