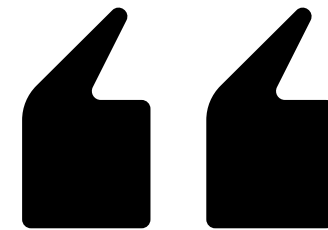

The Big Three in 2025



IMLS Advocacy

In **March 2025**, an Executive Order reduced funding and staff for the Institute of Museum and Library Services. RAILS responded with coordinated advocacy, media outreach, and the Numbers That Count campaign.

Baker & Taylor Closure

In **October 2025**, Baker & Taylor announced plans to wind down operations. RAILS supported libraries with vendor comparison assistance while transitioning more than 800 eRead Illinois libraries to The Palace Project.

RSA Independence

On **January 1, 2026**, Resource Sharing Alliance (RSA) became an independent employer after years of planning with RAILS. The transition aligns RSA with other regional consortia while maintaining a strong partnership.
