The SEMANTIC is important in accessibility because allow a wide range of users to understand and predict the structure of the page, the relationship between elements and how they work.

Where possible use the native HTML5 tags in combo with the aria attributes and roles.

Here some common examples:

- <header>, <nav>, <main>, <aside>, <footer>, etc.: use HTML5 semantic tags; remember to use the arialabelledby attribute to set a meaningful accessible name to non-unique components.
- <h1>, <h2>, <h3>, <h4>, <h5>, <h6>: use headings for the topics of the page or sections.
- <a> and <button>: remember that link elements are used to jump the user from a page to another one, buttons are used to activate a control.
- , , : use unordered/ordered lists and list items to inform the user about the structure of list components providing boundaries for each block.
- aria-label, aria-labelledby and aria-describedby: use those attributes to provide meaningful accessible name and description when the text displayed is not sufficient.
- aria-haspopup, aria-expanded, aria-controls, etc.: use those attributes to inform the user and allowing him/her to predict the behaviour of a functionality.
