1.4.10 (AA) - Reflow	Worldcat.org accessibility testing revealed that pages are responsive but noted some issues with content needing to scroll slightly horizontally at the smallest viewport width of 320 pixels.	Content displayed in tables does not reflow properly at narrow viewport widths. Users who zoom or use small screens may be forced to scroll horizontally, making it difficult to read and interact with the information.		Closed	November 2025
1.4.1 (A) - Use of color	Worldcat.org accessibility testing revealed one issue with the use of color to denote which page is currently active in content carousels.	Color alone is used to convey information or indicate status, making it difficult for users who cannot perceive color differences to understand meaning or take action.		Closed	October 2025
3.1.2 (AA) - Language of parts	Worldcat.org accessibility testing revealed that when library names or book titles are in other languages, they need specific language attributes.	Screen readers cannot properly pronounce different languages in the language selection menu due to missing language declarations.		Closed	October 2025
3.3.3 (AA) - Error suggestions	Worldcat.org accessibility testing revealed some issues in the create account workflow with providing specific suggestions to resolve errors.	Error messages do not consistently provide clear suggestions for how to fix problems.		Closed	March 2026
